From the Settlement Desk

The Kids are Back

This past December the Settlement was again filled with the familiar sounds of children's laughter and little

feet's pitter-patter. Our **Holiday Traditions** field trip program heralded in the return of public schools. Public school kids have not been allowed to go on field trips since early 2020 because of the pandemic. This December we had kindergarten and 1st grade classes from Spruce Creek, McInnis, Blue Lake, and others visit for their end of the semester field trip. We had roughly 1000 kids come through the program between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Last year we only had about 90. The Holiday Tradition field trip is a special program that teaches kids about the origins of traditions from around the world such as poinsettias from Mexico, St Lucia's light festival from Sweden, and popcorn stringing from the USA.





Weekday school groups weren't our only wee-ones we welcomed this past December. Scout Pack 436 had a Friday and Saturday night campout at the Settlement. On Saturday, after a hearty camp breakfast, the scouts went back in time to learn about the crafts of the Florida pioneers and Seminoles such as weaving, tool making, and wood working. Education and preservation of history is a big part of our mission statement, and we've been providing a unique field trip environment for kids for the past 45+ years. It is not uncommon to overhear chaperoning parents reminisce to their kids about when they came here on their field trip when they were their age.

Let's Go Camping!



You might have seen RVs parked in our fields during your recent visit to the Barberville Pioneer Settlement. Those belong to Harvest Host members taking advantage of us being a Harvest Host location. What is Harvest Host? It is a boondocking camping club for RV owners. have taken self-guided tours of the museum. Several have even made generous donations. 





2021 we said good-bye to beloved friends that went to their eternal homes. Our memories of the time we spent together at the Settlement are inadequate but treasured. These large-hearted folks will all be missed greatly. The losses of them are felt daily.

Steve Vrooman. After serving his country in the Navy as well as retiring from a private sector career he found a new home at the Settlement when he started to volunteer here in the late 1980's. Best known as "Steve, the Weaver" he attended almost every event and was a favorite demonstrator among our students and adult guests.

<u>Richard McCutcheon</u> was a seasonal work camper who returned to the Settlement every fall for the last 3 years. He was a train enthusiast who loved the Pierson Train Depot. He spent countless hours maintaining and reviving its model railroad.

<u>Emmie Swisher</u> was a settlement Emergency Service team member here. She and her husband established the Volusia First Responders Children's Charity in 2018.

We also fondly remember <u>Ronnie Fowler</u>. He was a long time FABA member, blacksmith volunteer, and a mentor to many. <u>Marcia Jeanne Jackson</u> was a former Settlement Board member. Her kindness and wisdom cannot be replaced.
